From points north: From Rt. 50 go south on Rt. 709 (Zulla Rd) to stop sign at Rt. 55, west (right) on Rt. 55, through stop light, to Marshall United Methodist Church on left at 8405 W. Main Street.

From points east: Take I66 W. to exit 28, north on Rt. 17 to stop light, west (left) on Rt. 55 to Marshall United Methodist Church on left.

From Warrenton and points south: Take Rt. 17 north to light at Rt. 55, west (left) on Rt. 55 to Marshall United Methodist Church on left.

From points west: Take I66 E. to exit 27, north on Rt. 721 to stop sign, east (right) on Rt. 55 to Marshall United Methodist Church on right.
