To workshop at St. Luke's Episcopal:

From points north:

Take US-15/29 S from Warrenton to second
Remington exit (blinking light) at Freeman's Ford
Rd./Rt. 651. Turn left onto Church Street, con-
tinuing for two blocks to another left into St.
Luke's Episcopal Church lot.

From Fredericksburg and points east:

From I-95, take US-17W for approx. 15 mi. to left
onto Freeman's Ford Rd./Rt. 651 just after Gold-
vein Mining Museum. Continue on Rt. 651 for
approx. 12 mi. to right onto Church Street, and
ahead for two blocks to St. Luke's on left.

From points south:

Take US-15/29N from Culpeper to southernmost
Remington exit at US-15 BR. Cross over Rappa-
hannock River to intersection with Main Street.
Left at Main, followed by first right onto Church
St., and ahead for two blocks to St. Luke's on left.

To reception at Inn at Kelly's Ford:

From St. Luke's Episcopal Church:

Take right out of lot onto Church Street, followed
by left at Main, continuing through town and
across railroad tracks. Bear right after tracks for
approx. 5 mi. on Rt. 651 to right at Kelly's Ford
Rd and bridge over Rappahannock River. Left at
Edward's Shop Road, following signs to Inn.
