The Rappahannock-Rapidan Region is located in the foothills of Virginia's Northern Piedmont Region. The region covers approximately 2,002 square miles of land and is home to 149,200 persons. The region is bounded on the west by the Blue Ridge Mountains and located approximately 75 miles southwest of Washington, D. C. and 90 miles northwest of Richmond. The region enjoys mild winters and warm summers with an average annual temperature of 55 degrees Fahrenheit and has an average annual precipitation of 38.29 inches.

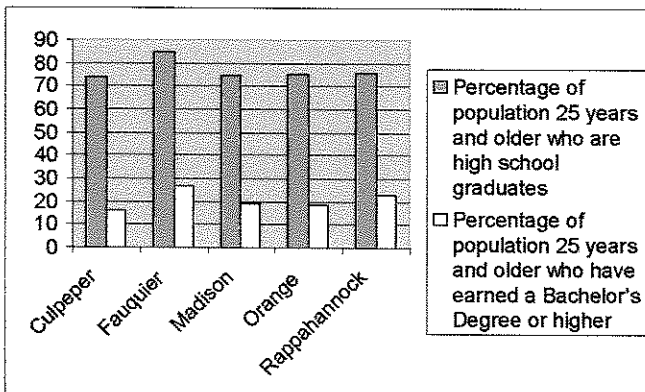

Public School Enrollment

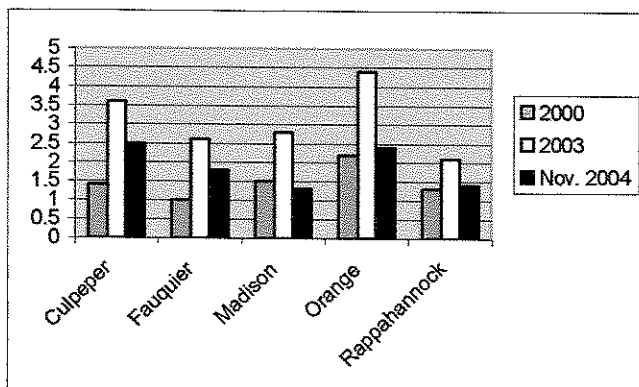

Attractions: Some include: James Madison's Montpelier, over twenty wineries, Civil War re-enactments, Wilderness Battlefield, James Madison Museum, Graves Mountain Lodge, pick your own farms and orchards, Four County Players, Museum of Culpeper History, Mosby Area Heritage Tour, John S. Mosby Museum.

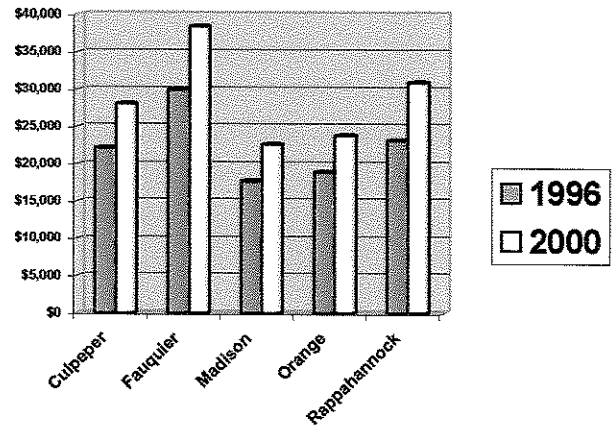
